1st International Familial Mediterranean Fever Day (FMF) on 17th September 2017

The FMF & AID Global Association, a global umbrella organization, representing patients with FMF (Familial Mediterranean Fever) and other autoinflammatory diseases, is launching the 1st International Familial Mediterranean Fever Day on 17th September 2017, in cooperation with its member associations and patient groups.

FMF is one of the most common of the autoinflammatory diseases and has its origins in the Jewish/Arab Eastern Mediterranean regions, however, it is still considered a rare disease. The aim is to raise awareness amongst doctors, patients, local authorities, the general public and to offer assistance.

This disease is based upon a genetic defect and is characterized by recurrent episodes of fever and painful inflammation. If left untreated, it can have serious consequences such as permanent organ damage and it may even lead to death. Regular medication and close control are essential. Through global migration, patients are now found worldwide. More and more cases are now being found with no known ancestors from these regions and are assumed to be spontaneous mutations.

On 17th September 2017, in addition to events and activities in the German-speaking countries, affiliated patient representatives will also mark the 1st International FMF Day. So far, the following associations have registered to participate:
